### **NEW BEGINNINGS**


Each chapter that is ending Leads us to a new beginning. The past that we are leaving Means a future we are winning.

Miss the least?


The fact that my desk was 15 feet from a washroom and hearing passing bells.

#### Miss the least?


All the grading and paperwork.

Miss the least?


Grading essays.

Miss the least?


The homework. I've grown weary of the paper grading and preparation for 4 different classes.

Miss the least?


The temperature problems from one class to another. The never ending grading of papers on a strict time structure on <u>Block</u>.

Miss the least?


Recreating the wheel – paperwork – inconsistencies.

#### Miss the least?


As the Special Education Department has increased the amount of paperwork has increased logarithmically – I won't miss that!

#### Miss the least?


I won't miss that sleepless night the day before school opens, the early mornings, late nights, and papers, papers, papers.
