
MISS THE LEAST? That's easy, getting up at 5 a.m.! I plan to sleep in until 7. And, of course, writing college recommendations!!!

### WORDS OF WISDOM?


Bloom where you're planted!

### MOST LIKELY TO BE REMEMBERED FOR AT HEHS?


Hopefully, being able to make a difference.
